2030 Carbon Footprint 2030 Target is <71.53Kg average week per 100 km = Green, Using the calculation that 1 litre Diesel produces 2.63kg CO₂ (Defra figure), and that a good diesel return would be 32lt/100km = 84.16kg.

<71.53 = Green

71.54 – 78.24 = Amber

>78.25 = Red

- The business will set annual targets for progressive improvement yearly to 2030
- Use of CNG Gas on internal FLT fleet on a phased basis with the introduction of electric FLT vehicles where feasible, starting from Q1 2026
- Ensuring safe loading and security of products prior to exit of Gyproc premises with the safety of all other road users.
- Serving the needs of our customers by providing products and services that meet or exceed their quality expectations.
- Development of procedures to ensure secure loading and security of product during transportation.
- Development of employees who operate equipment involved in the loading and security of product for distribution including FLT and Shunter operator training, FLT operator electronic order completion, loading plan administration, weighbridge, and sales administration.
- Continuous learning through OPL and GPL Toolbox Talks and company communication in relation to safe loading, security, and distribution of products.
- Permitting only suitably qualified persons to drive and operate vehicles associated with distribution of products and implementation of company business through use of company vehicles.

Gyproc will routinely set and review achievement of specific objectives and targets for continuous improvement in Health & Safety, Environmental and Quality Management, and comply with the standards of independently verified management systems including OHSAS 18001, ISO 14001, ISO 9001, and BES 6001

Gyproc will use appropriate training, involvement, development, and communication with all our employees and other relevant parties, including the suppliers of goods and services, to actively promote:

- Awareness of Health & Safety procedures,
- Responsibility towards the Environment,
- Understanding of product Quality.
